Sephardic Jews (Eastern Tradition) prepared huevos haminados (baked eggs) for the Sabbath. Eggs, onion skins and water were baked or simmered for hours. The onion skins darken the eggshells and give the eggs a distinctive flavor. The eggs served for Passover are also onion dyed.
